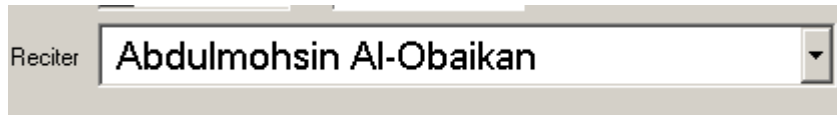


TO LISTEN TO A QURAN SURAH

Select Chapter



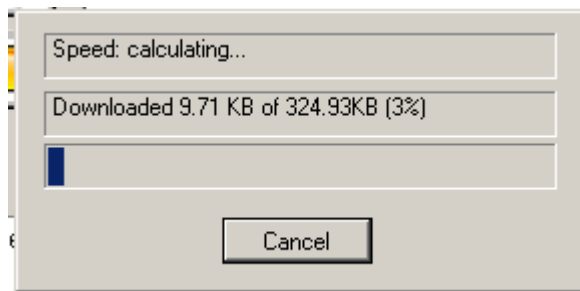
Select Reciter



Press Play

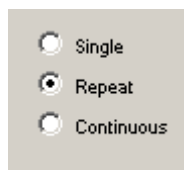


If you do not already have the selected file, wait for the player to download it.



You may press Pause  to pause and Stop  to stop at anytime during the playback.

You may set the play mode to single, repeat, or continuous. Single plays only the selected Chapter, Repeat plays the selected chapter over and over, and continuous keeps playing the next chapter as well as the next reciter when the current reciter is complete. Needed files will automatically download under all modes.



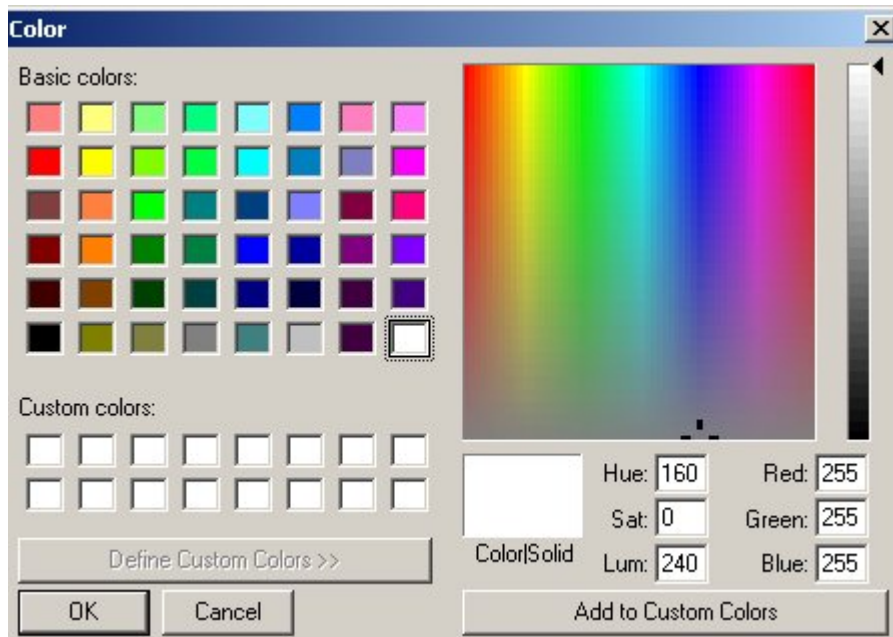
You may set the speed to a percent of normal speed



You may set the background color of the display boxes by clicking the Color button



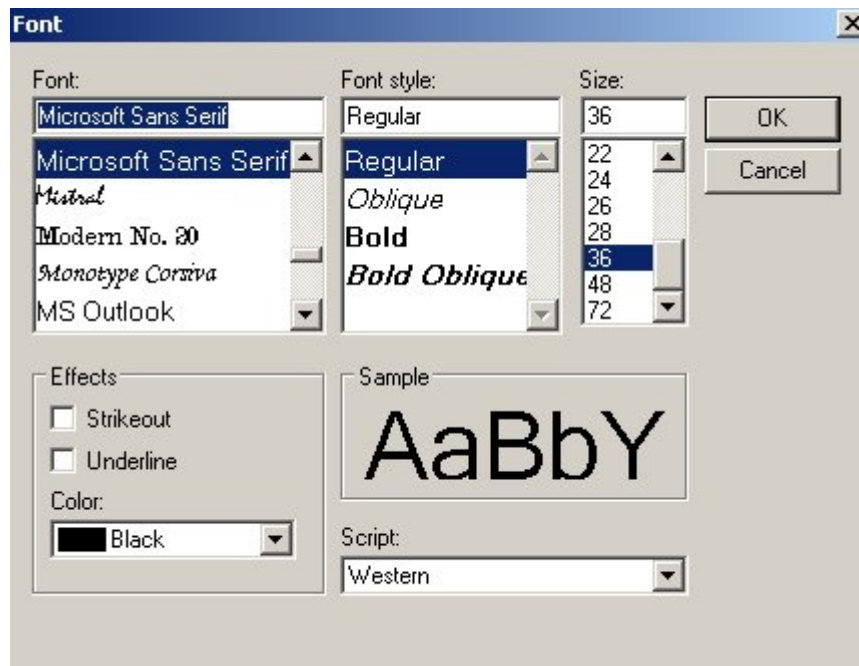
And then selecting the desired color and pressing OK



You may set the font of the display boxes by clicking font button



And selecting the desired font and pressing OK



You may change the volume by scrolling the volume controller

You may select a translation from



If you do not have the selected translation file, it will be downloaded.

If the file that is currently playing has not been defined in the player (the player defines by saving a .quran file next to the .mp3 file)

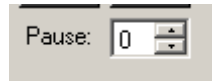


You must click Next or press Esc on your keyboard to change verses on the screen.

If you click all the way till the last verse, the player will automatically save the positions in a .quran file so that next time you play this file do not have to click Next or press Esc.

If the file that is currently playing has been defined in the player (the player defines by saving a .quran file next to the .mp3 file)

You may sit back and watch the verses change spontaneously.



You may also set a pause time between verses to give you more time to read

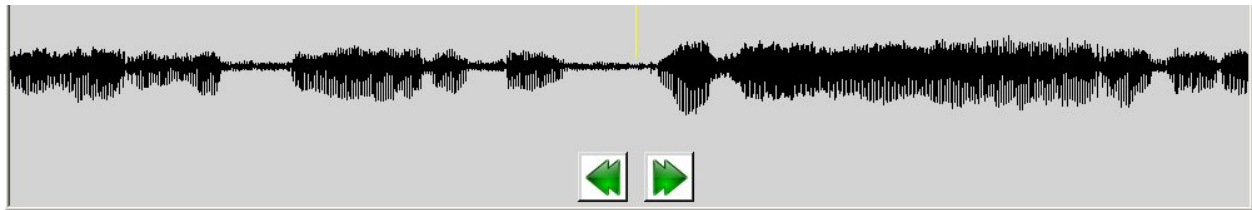
And if you're unsatisfied with how the verses are playing, you may delete the .quran file by clicking



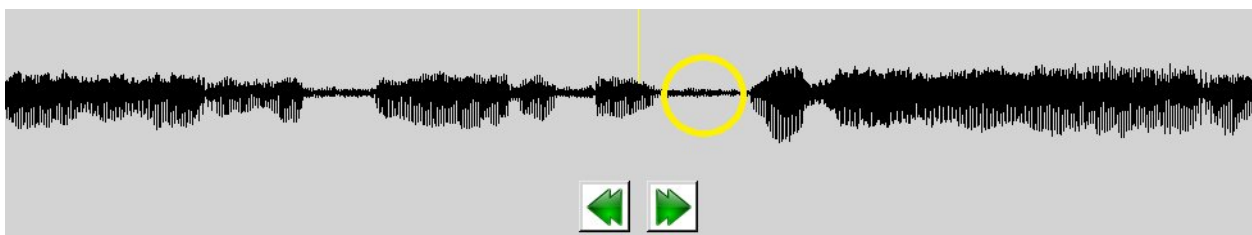
If you do so, you will have to press Next or Esc to redefine the file.

Since the file is defined, a graph like this will show

The yellow marker is the current verse end marker. To the right are the two seconds of audio after it, and the two seconds of audio before the marker.




If for example the graph looked like this (circle added in paint)



You can see the yellow marker is not on the low part of the audio (shown in the circle). Which probably means you placed the marker a few milliseconds too early and you need to press the right arrow to move it. Some verses are read with no pause in between, so there won't necessarily be a low line at the marker so you must use judgment.

If you play the file till the end, the change you made to the markers will save automatically.



To cut the current file into several files according to the marker you have placed press . When the process is complete the folder where the files were saved will open in windows explorer.
